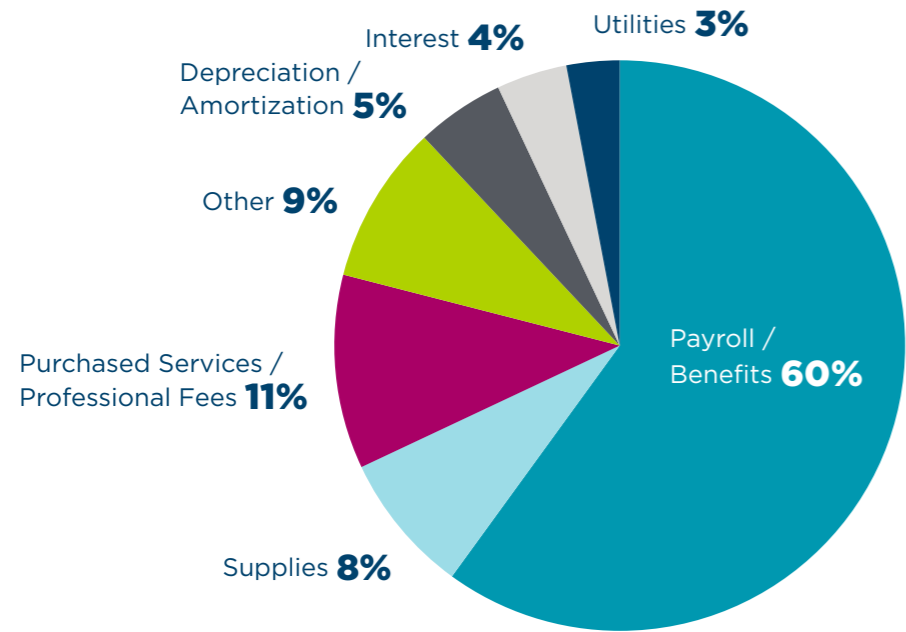

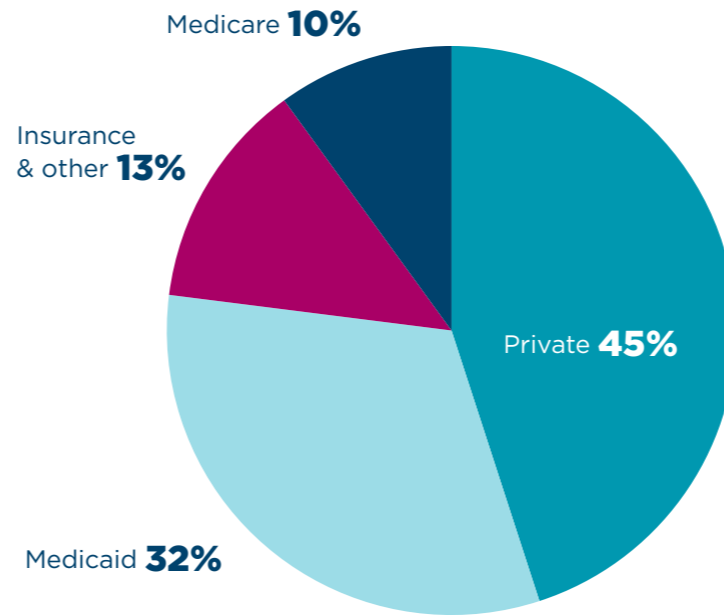

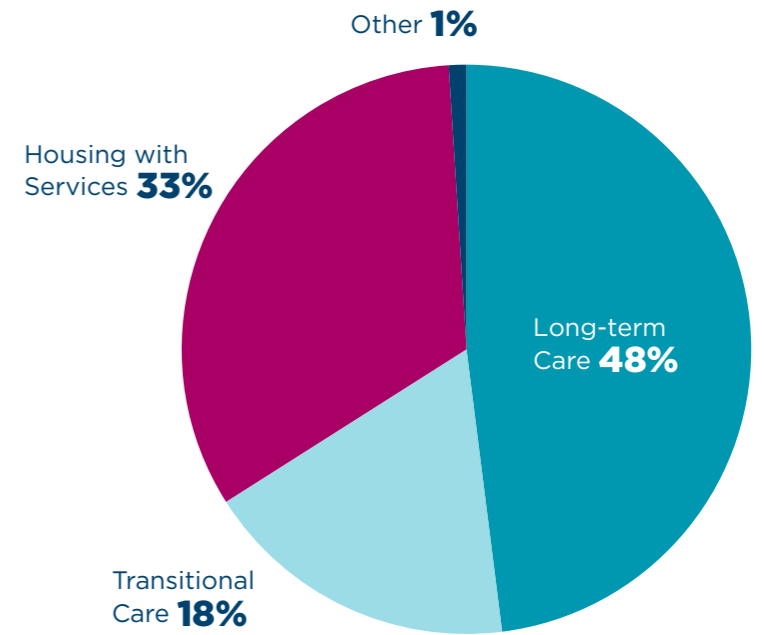
REVENUE AND EXPENSES



Expenses by Type

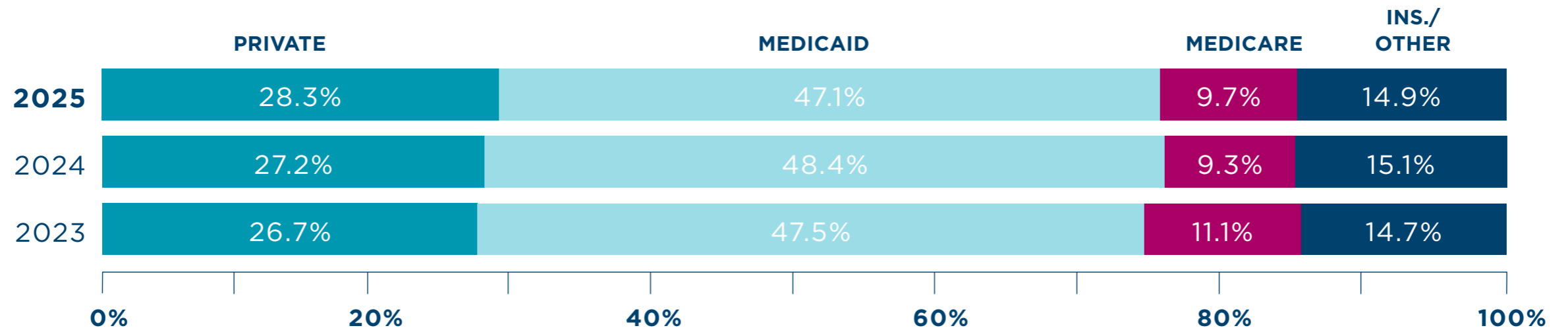


Revenue by Payor

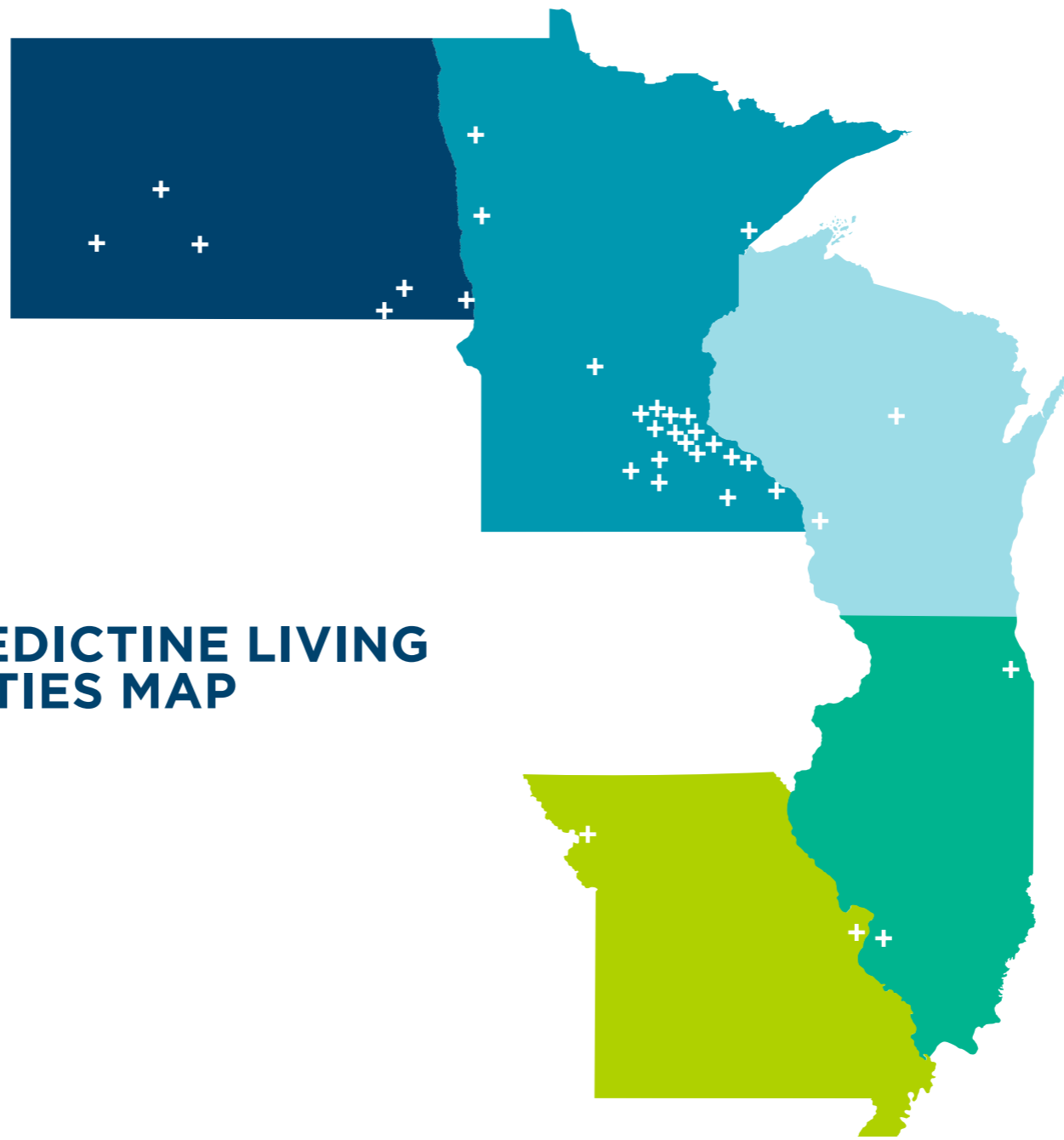
